STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

As part of the New Jersey Department of Education's plans to survey all core curriculum content areas not included in the statewide assessment program, we are conducting the New Jersey Visual and Performing Arts Survey. This survey is the first time the Department of Education has collected information about the implementation of the New Jersey Core Curriculum Content Standards for the Visual and Performing Arts and examined the depth and breadth of their implementation in New Jersey's public schools.

The Visual and Performing Arts Education Survey is part of a broader New Jersey Arts Education Census Project, a partnership among the New Jersey Department of Education, the New Jersey State Council on the Arts, the Geraldine R. Dodge Foundation, Playwrights Theatre of New Jersey and the Music for All Foundation. This partnership will provide schools, policy makers, and community leaders with an analysis of arts education while at the same time providing schools and communities with tools and resources to strengthen student learning in the arts.

The results of this survey will be previewed in the spring of 2006 with a final report presented in September of 2006. These results will help the Department of Education and our project partners understand the impact of the New Jersey Core Curriculum Content Standards for the Arts on school programs, the level of student involvement with the arts, and how to align resources to areas of need.
